## **IB LEARNER PROFILE**

The aim of the IB programmes is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and more shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world.

#### As IB learners we strive to be:

**INQUIRERS** They develop their natural curiosity. They acquire the skills necessary to conduct inquiry and research and show independence in learning. They actively enjoy learning and this love of learning will be sustained throughout their lives.

**KNOWLEDGEABLE** They explore concepts, ideas and issues that have local and global significance. In so doing, they acquire in-depth knowledge and develop understanding across a broad and balanced range of disciplines.

**THINKERS** They exercise initiative in applying thinking skills critically and creatively to recognize and approach complex problems, and make reasoned, ethical decisions.

I Liceum Ogólnokształcące im. Stanisława Staszica w Lublinie is a school, where we work in a friendly, open and respectful atmosphere. That is why the school is open to all formal and informal complaints in order to improve our service and procedures.

The procedures cover the following complaints:

- 1. complaints related to the students' educational performance;
- 2. complaints related to the students' school's activities;
- 3. complaints related to the procedures of the school and decisions of the governing body.

Complaints concerning the semester and end-of-year assessment are regulated by the school charter and comply with the Polish educational regulations.

## COMPLAINTS REGARDING THE IB DP PROGRAMME

Complaints related to the IB DP Programme at I Liceum Ogólnokształcące im. Stanisława Staszica w Lublinie can be related to:

 violation of the rules and regulations stated by the IB in its documents and policies;

- activities, conduct or omission on behalf of any members of the school staff, including DP Coordinator, CAS Coordinator, teachers and EE supervisors;
- lack of support and training in terms of academic integrity;
- lack of supervision or inadequate support given to students;
- failure to support students with access inclusive arrangements;
- failure to inform students of assessment criteria and procedures.

# Complaints that will not be accepted:

- complaints related to the deadlines of internal calendars;
- complaints regarding the regulations of the programme included in the IB documents and policies;
- complaints regarding the regulations of the national educational system.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) organization acknowledges that it does not intervene in matters concerning decisions made by an IB World School, emphasizing that: "IB World Schools are entirely independent from the IB and are solely responsible for the implementation and quality of teaching of their programmes. The IB has no jurisdiction over decisions made by the IB World Schools, as set forth in the General Regulations."

## THE COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

## Stage one (informal)

The parents/ legal guardians should try to resolve the problem by contacting the form teacher, subject teacher or member of staff directly involved in the problem.

If the problem arises, the parents/ formal guardians should contact the member of staff directly by writing a message via email or the Vulcan register, telephone conversation or in person by appointment.

When the above actions are not effective, one should proceed to the next stage and make a formal complaint.

# Stage two (formal)

If the complaint is not resolved at stage one, the complaint should be made in a formal way. It should also be addressed to the head of the school.

The complaint should be stated clearly, in writing.

The complaints to the head of the school could also be made by other parties involved in the school such as parents' body or students' body.

All the complaints are heard and decided upon the legal regulations by the head of the school within 14 days from the formal complaint in a confident and fair manner.

## COMPLAINTS REGARDING FINAL GRADES AWARDED BY THE IB

- A candidate's final assessment work (internal or external) may be re-marked as part of the Enquiry Upon Results service (EUR) provided by the IB.
- 2. All details on this procedure and applied fee structure may be obtained from the IB DP Coordinator.
- 3. All candidates should bear in mind that re-marking a candidate's assessment material may lead to a higher or lower grade for the subject.

All the official correspondence concerning complaints is recorded by the school's office with the regard of confidentiality.

The policy is reviewed biannually by IB DP teachers.
